Wet rooms

A wet room is the ultimate solution for those whose mobility is such that they require completely level access showering facilities.



It is more accessible

In a wet room, the showering area is contiguous with the rest of the room, eliminating the need for a threshold and allowing users with reduced mobility to access showering facilities often without assistance.

It is safer

Wet room flooring is designed to be warm underfoot and anti-slip, even when wet.

It requires lower maintenance

A wet room eliminates the risk of water spillages or overspray escaping and penetrating the fabric of the building, where it can cause expensive damage to drywall and timber, and shock or fire hazard with electrical supply.

Walk-in Showers

A walk-in shower allows unimpeded access between the changing and showering areas of the bathroom and is designed to contain all showering water without the inconvenience of hinged or sliding doors.

If a shower is fitted with a level access tray, this is set flush with the rest of the bathroom floor and requires a threshold of 10mm or less. Wheelchair users can therefore access the shower area without assistance and ambulant users are less at risk of trips and falls.

This can often reduce the need of carer intervention, which brings benefits in terms of maintaining the dignity of users and releasing carers for other tasks.



If a resident has reasonable mobility, a low-level access shower may be more suitable. This features a small step of 60mm or less, so would be unsuited to wheelchair access, but installation is simpler, particularly if the shower is replacing an existing shower or bath.

Assisted Baths

An assisted bath combines the wellbeing benefits of immersive bathing, with enhanced accessibility that reduces carer intervention, and innovative design that minimises water consumption and utility bills.

Assisted baths are manufactured in a wide range of designs, incorporating many labour-saving and cost-efficient features. While no bath offers all of these, it's worth considering what options are available and might best suit your needs.



Transfer seats

A transfer seat allows the bather to be placed comfortably in a sitting position alongside the bath and then carried effortlessly over the edge of the bath and immersed in the water. The bather remains on the seat while washing and is then returned to the start position outside the bath. There is a safety strap which ensures safe transferring of the bather.

Adjustable height

Height-adjustable lifting make it easier for a bather with limited mobility to enter and exit the bath, and if carer assistance is required during bathing, reduces back strain for the carer caused by bending over.





High-speed, auto-fill and thermostatic fillers

An auto-fill function allows the bather and carer to focus on bath preparation without attending to the bath, and controls water consumption more effectively. A thermostatic filler guarantees the bath is filled with water at optimum temperature and prevents discomfort and potential scalding if the water needs refreshing or topping up.

Antimicrobial properties

Assisted baths manufactured from materials with antimicrobial properties can reduce the risk of cross-contamination between bathers whose resistance to infection is likely to be compromised.

Mobile or Portable

Because of their versatility, these self-contained hoists are the most widely-used system. They are easily transportable and moved between rooms.

They can be used to lift users into and out of a bed or bath, on and off a toilet or chair, in and out of a vehicle, or even from the floor in the event of a fall.



Gantry

A gantry hoist is capable of hoisting across a distance of two to five metres without moving the gantry frame, whereas a mobile hoist would need to be moved while loaded to cover the equivalent distance.

This makes a gantry hoist the preferable option for medium-term use in a particular location. As it is freestanding, a gantry hoist can be easily redeployed when the requirement changes.

Ceiling Track

A ceiling track hoist is the best option for safe, efficient transfer where hoisting needs are more permanent and may be required between multiple points around a room.

Ceiling track hoists may also be operated by the user without carer intervention, giving them greater independence and reducing staffing requirements.



Access Ramps

While many homes have the benefits of modern, purpose built facilities designed to allow uninhibited access, other homes require access solutions to assist safe access in and out of a property.

In these cases, or where access is only required temporarily or occasionally, EA Mobility offers a wide range of portable, demountable and permanent solutions.

Quick and easy to deploy, our folding portable ramps are the lightest on the market yet have the highest strength-to-weight ratio. Manufactured in a range of sizes and configurations, they are fitted with safety hinges for pinch protection and clips that hold them together for compact storage.
